

# Great Success Achieved

The annual Hakumon Festival ended with a great success, and it served to deepen mutual understanding between the campus and the society.

The festival started with an opening address by Satoshi Aoi, the Chairman of the Festival Executive Committee.

He stressed that the school festival must be a function aimed at displaying researches made by students and, at the same time, deepening mutual understanding between the campus and the society.

For this purpose, various events were carried out in the auditorium and classroom for three days, and Chuonians and visitors to the school enjoyed them.

This year, the festival was carried out separate from the drama festival, and many popular artistes were invited to it. The annual fancy parade which was held on the eve of the festival was abolished.

Their performances were greatly appreciated by a large number of audiences.

On the other hand, an entertainment contest was held for the first time among Chuo students on the festival eve before a panal of judges, including professor Haruo Komatsu, Mr. Hoshino, Chief of the Student Section of Chuo University, and Tatsuo Fujimoto, a member of the Chuo Swimming Club.

On the first day, following a lecture by Mr. Masaharu Hatanaka some dramas were staged in the auditorium. Folk dances were also played on the campus ground, and they were very much enjoyed by the participants.


The second-day program was featured by a good will music concert held in the auditorium with four Tokyo universities participating. Refined performances by members of the music club of each university attracted the audiences' attention.




"You look like a story teller." A entertainment contest for Chuo students was carried out in the eve of the festival. Their performances raised much laughter in the auditorium.




Who is responsible for juvenile delinquency? Today there has been rapid increase of juvenile delinquency in number.






# Researches Made By Students Bear Fruit

Whoever visited a small room could taste an atomosphere of mountain climbing. Wander Voegel Club members pitched a camp in the room which was crowded with visi-




